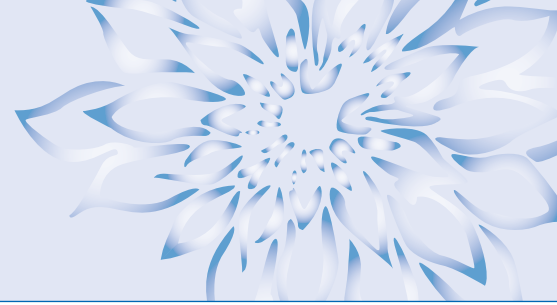

## MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF 6<sup>TH</sup> MALAYSIAN COLORECTAL CONFERENCE

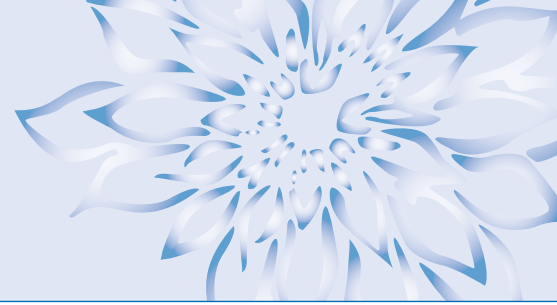
